WEEK 1: July 13th to the 17th | WEEK 2: August 24th to the 28th

Enrich your child's love of animals with a behind the scenes experience at ZOOMARS Petting Zoo. Campers will work side by side with the zookeepers and learn how the animals are fed, groomed and cared for. Campers will feed the goats, groom the guinea pigs, bathe a tortoise and help train a miniature donkey to walk calmly on a leash. The zoo's veterinarian will talk about her job and teach us about animals she's been treating with special needs. We'll watch a farrier fit horses for shoes, work with the avian staff to prepare food bowls and make our way through the breeding cages, inspecting nests and checking for eggs. The Animal Care Manager will explain what she looks for on her daily rounds and teach us what the animals really eat after a day of snacking on veggies.

Zoo Campers will learn there's a lot more to running a zoo than just tending to the animals as they build nest boxes, help out on the tractor and make repairs to fences and pens. Everyone will get to ride the ponies, hop aboard the mini train and spend lots of cuddle time with the bunnies, guinea pigs and goats. ZOO CAMP is a special adventure where campers become zookeepers and get to learn what it might be like to work with animals when they grow up.

9 AM - 1 PM | July 20th to the 24th

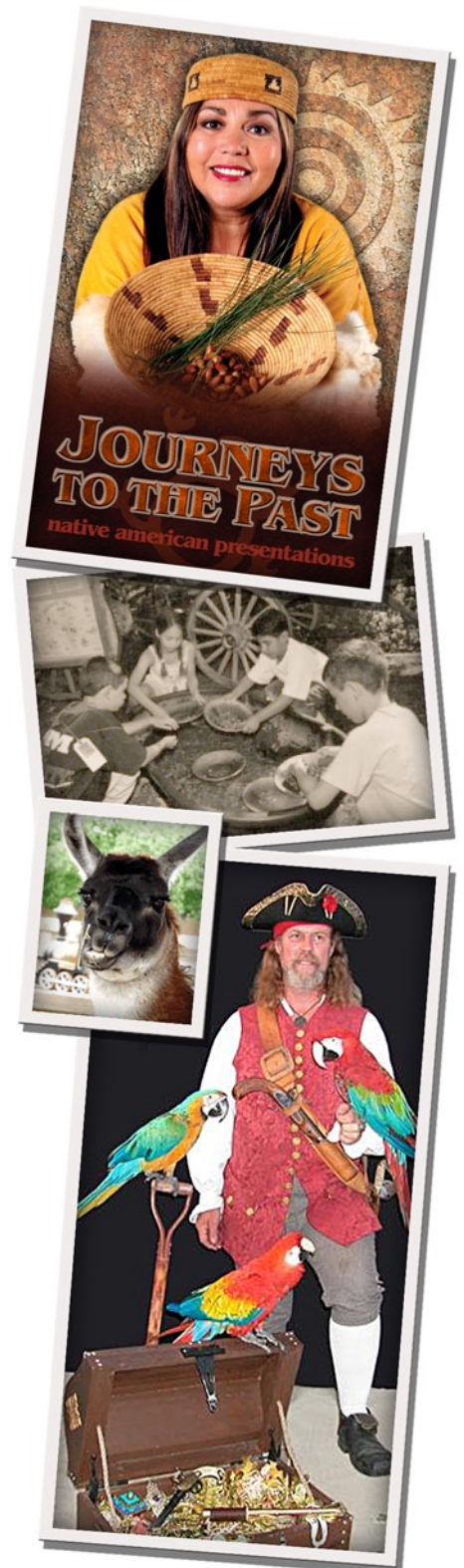

There will be singing, dancing and storytelling as campers experience a time when people lived in harmony with Mother Earth. California's Gold Rush Era will also be explored as little pioneers pan for gold, then cash in their findings to buy goodies at the General Store.

Children will have the opportunity to make candles, shave with a popsicle stick, pump water by hand and wash clothes on a scrub board, just like the old timers. Campers will explore the petting zoo, saddle up their ponies and learn about ranching, roping and horsemanship. Journeys Camp is a wonderful opportunity for children to have fun while learning about California history in a wholesome, outdoor setting amidst their favorite animals.
